To prepare students for a college preparatory high school that will ensure success and graduation from a four year college.








# STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS












The academic goal of Parma Academy was for all students to show one or more years of growth in Reading and Math. This goal was achieved as evidenced by the school's Progress component data where fourth grade met the state's student growth expectation in English Language Arts (ELA) and Math and additionally by i-Ready assessment data where most students met or exceeded growth targets within the year. The school additionally increased its Performance Index (PI) score by an outstanding 33% and earned a four-star rating for exceeding state standards in closing educational gaps.
